Collective Responsibilities

Text: 1 Corinthians 12:27

In our text, Paul explained that Christians were individually part of a collective body. They each had a role to play and responsibilities as individuals. They were also to contribute to the function of the body as a whole. In this lesson and the previous one, we're going to discuss these different responsibilities. In this lesson, we're going to consider our responsibilities to one another.

Assemble Together (Hebrews 10:24-25)

- We come together to encourage one another willful absence is discouraging to others
- There ought to be an expectation that we will be together (1 Corinthians 11:33)

Encourage One Another (Heb. 3:12-13)

- It is possible for Christians to fall away and be lost (cf. Galatians 5:4; 1 Corinthians 9:27)
- This encouragement is needed regularly and consistently "day after day"

Correct One Another (James 5:19-20)

- When one sins/departs, we should work to correct them and bring them back to the Lord
- However, we can only do this from a position of spiritual maturity (Galatians 6:1)

Help One Another (Acts 4:32-35)

- An extraordinary need was met with extraordinary sacrifice possible because they were "of one heart and soul"
- We need to put others first make sacrifices for others (Galatians 4:15)

Tolerate One Another (Romans 14:1)

- Not everyone will think the same way or have the same background, opinions, or understanding
- Tolerate matters of opinion not sin (cf. 1 Corinthians 5:1-2); [see earlier point on correcting one another]

Submit to One Another (Ephesians 5:21)

- This is not about "official" authority it is about how we are to defer to others
- We are to regard others as more important than ourselves (Philippians 2:3-4)

Work Together (Ephesians 4:16)

- Paul described the church as a self-edifying body as we work together, the body grows
- Each of us has a role to play in this (1 Corinthians 12:14-27)

Conclusion

- While we will each stand before the Lord in judgment as individuals, we also have a responsibility as part of the body
- God designed the church for our mutual benefit let us work together and encourage one another while each one of us strives to be faithful to the Lord
